

The Business AI Canvas: A Framework for Smarter Automation Decisions

The Business AI Canvas

Section	Purpose	Example Prompts / Questions
1. Problem / Opportunity	Clearly define what task or process needs improvement.	What's the bottleneck or inefficiency? Is it data-heavy, repetitive, or decision-based?
2. Current Process	Map how it's done today and by whom.	Who performs this? How long does it take? How often? What tools are used?
3. Potential for Automation	Decide whether automation (with or without AI) is justified.	Could this be handled by a rule-based system, or does it need reasoning and context?
4. AI Role / Type	Identify what kind of AI could help.	LLM for text? Agentic workflow for planning? ML model for prediction?
5. Human-in-the-Loop	Define how humans will stay involved.	Is human review needed? At what checkpoints?
6. Data Inputs & Quality	Identify the data required and whether it exists.	Do we have structured data? Are permissions or privacy issues involved?
7. Expected Outcomes / KPIs	Define success.	Time saved, error reduction, engagement, cost reduction, etc.
8. Tools & Platforms	List what tech is needed.	Zapier, Make, LangChain, OpenAI, CRM APIs, etc.
9. Risks & Constraints	Acknowledge ethical, financial, or operational limits.	Security, bias, data access, ROI threshold.
10. ROI / Effort vs. Value Matrix	Quickly visualize payoff.	(Plot low vs. high effort; low vs. high impact to decide what's worth automating.)

The AI Readiness Matrix

For a quick decision-making tool, pair the Canvas with this 2×2 **AI Readiness Matrix**:

Effort to Automate	Value Gained
Low Effort + High Value → Automate now	
High Effort + High Value → Plan for future	
Low Effort + Low Value → Optional	
High Effort + Low Value → Skip	

How to Use the Business AI Canvas

1. Start with Discovery

Before jumping into a build, map the process and problems on the Canvas.

2. Engage the Team

Have both business and technical members fill out sections together to avoid blind spots.

3. Evaluate the Fit

Use the AI Readiness Matrix to assess whether the idea is worth pursuing.

4. Document and Revisit

Save each completed Canvas. Over time, you'll see patterns in where automation drives the most value—and where it doesn't.

The Business AI Canvas helps prevent wasteful AI projects. It creates clarity and structure in an era of hype, guiding teams to apply automation *strategically* instead of reactively. The best automation decisions come not from technology-first thinking, but from problem-first discovery.
